Healthcare facilities transition from paper to Electronic Health Records

Paterson, NJ – Passaic County Community College is one of eight New Jersey colleges offering unemployed and underemployed workers the opportunity to train for a good job in the Health IT field. Experts predict more than 50,000 workers will be needed to fill Health IT jobs over the next five years.

The grant funded Health It training programs will prepare workers to fill jobs in hospitals, doctor's offices, and other health care facilities that are transitioning to electronic recordkeeping and will need employees qualified in Electronic Health Records (EHR)

PCCC offers three non-degree; credit based EHR Certificates in Workflow Redesign and Information Management Specialist, Implementation, Technical and Software Support Specialist, and Trainer. Students will be awarded Certificates of Achievement upon successful completion.

Scholarships are available and space is limited for the intensive six month training program. To be eligible for the program, applicants must demonstrate college level English and Reading skills as well as math skills at least at the pre-college algebra level. Healthcare or IT experience is required. Students must also fulfill a pre-requisite basic course in computer information science.
